

#### COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

Just as my column was going into print, the Diocese sent us an update on the Covid-19 protocols for our parishes. As announced at Mass, the following is allowed to take place:

- 1)Masks are optional. Masks are no longer required for the distribution of Holy Communion but are optional. For those unvaccinated, I ask you to consider wearing a mask.
- 2) Hand sanitizing before and after distributing Holy Communion will still take place.
- 3)All disinfecting requirements have been removed.
- 4)At the sign off peace, we ask that you give a wave or a nod, unless you are with family or members of the same household.

The following protocols are still in effect until further notice:

- 1)Holy Water fonts will remain dry. We do offer Holy Water in a holy water dispenser in the vestibule.
- 2)Communion under one species only-the Host. A catechetical reminder: When we receive only the host or precious blood, the body and blood of Jesus are fully present in both species.
- 3)There is no offertory at the present time. The gifts are on the side of the altar. Even so, they are offered on all of our behalf.

The Holy Day Obligation will return on Saturday/Sunday August 14/15. If you have not been to church for a while, I invite you back. If your family and friends have not been here for a while, bring them. Thank you to everyone for your patience, prayers and flexibility during this unprecedented time. Thank you to all who gave of their time for sanitizing after each Mass. I am grateful to our Maintenance crew, Rocco and Kevin for all their work they have done to keep our church and school safe from Covid-19.

May God continue to guide and bless us as we journey to what we hope is the other side of this pandemic.

#### THE BISHOPS AND HOLY COMMUNION

Recently, our US Bishops held their annual June meeting virtually. The topic of the Eucharist came to the forefront. While I hesitate to offer my personal opinion, I am grateful that the Church is finally carrying a voice to politicians on Eucharistic Coherence, a document about the Church's teaching on the Eucharist. The term Eucharistic Coherence came from a 2007 document by Latin & South American Bishops, including Cardinal Brogolio (now Pope Francis). This document addressed the importance of Catholic politicians defending life against the evils of abortion and euthanasia and not going along with legality of such evils. Eucharistic consistency means that Catholics in public life need to live lives, consistent with Church teaching. Here is a summary of the USCCB (United States of Catholic Conference of Bishops) of the Questions and Answers on the U.S. Bishops' Vote to Draft a Document on the Meaning of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church.

The Eucharist is the source and summit of Christian life. The importance of nurturing an ever deeper understanding of the beauty and mystery of the Eucharist in our lives is not a new topic for the bishops. The document being drafted is not meant to be disciplinary in nature, nor is it targeted at any one individual or class of persons. It will include a section on the Church's teaching on the responsibility of every Catholic, including bishops, to live in accordance with the truth, goodness and beauty of the Eucharist we celebrate.

#### Why are the bishops doing this now?

For some time now, a major concern of the bishops has been the declining belief and understanding of the Eucharist among the Catholic faithful. This was a deep enough concern, that the theme of the bishops' strategic plan for 2021-2024 is Created Anew by the Body and Blood of Christ: Source of Our Healing and Hope. This important document on the Eucharist will serve as a foundation for the multi-year Eucharistic Revival Project, a major national effort to reignite Eucharistic faith in our country. It was clear from the intensity and passion expressed in the individual interventions made by the bishops during last week's meeting that each bishop deeply loves the Eucharist.

#### Did the bishops vote to ban politicians from receiving Holy Communion?

No, this was not up for vote or debate. The bishops made no decision about barring anyone from receiving Holy Communion. Each Catholic - regardless of whether they hold public office or not - is called to continual conversion, and the U.S. bishops have repeatedly emphasized the obligation of all Catholics to support human life and dignity and other fundamental principles of Catholic moral and social teaching.

#### Are the bishops going to issue a national policy on withholding Communion from politicians?

No. There will be no national policy on withholding Communion from politicians. The intent is to present a clear understanding of the Church's teachings to bring heightened awareness among the faithful of how the Eucharist can transform our lives and bring us closer to our creator and the life he wants for us.

#### Did the Vatican tell the bishops not to move forward on drafting the document?

No. The Holy See did encourage the bishops to engage in dialogue and broad consultation. Last week's meeting was the first part of that process. It is important to note that collaboration and consultation among the bishops will be key in the drafting of this document.

May we pray that the Holy Spirit guide our Bishops as they continue to move forward in the document on Eucharist Coherence which is vital to our very being as Catholics and human beings. I pray each of you have a blessed and safe summer. Remember, to include Christ Jesus in your life through prayer and going to Mass. You can even go while on vacation. Go to Masstimes.com.

#### Reflection for Next Sunday, July 4, 2021 Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Ezekiel 2:2-5
Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 12:7-10
Gospel: Mark 6:1-6
Jesus is rejected in His hometown.

#### **Family Connection**

Our family plays an important role in shaping us and forming our self-identity. In family life, we find a safe place to discover who we are and who God calls us to be. But sometimes the influences from outside our family can make us unrecognizable to those who know us best. These outside influences can lead us away from God, or they can lead us toward a deeper relationship with God. In today's Gospel, we see that the people of Nazareth could not recognize Jesus as the Son of God. They could know him only as the son of Mary. We hope that through our family life we will be encouraged to filter the many influences on our lives through the lens of faith so that we will become the person that God calls us to be. As you gather as a family, talk about the people and events that are influencing members of your family. Acknowledge that many of these people and events are positive influences, helping us be better people and leading us to a deeper relationship with God. Also acknowledge, however, that there are negative influences in our lives that risk pulling us away from God. Observe that Jesus was a person who allowed his relationship with God to be the most important thing in his life. This led many people to have faith in him as the Son of God. However, not everyone could recognize this about Jesus. Read today's Gospel, Mark 6:1-6. Ask: Who does not recognize Jesus as God's Son in this Gospel? (some of his kinfolk in Nazareth) Observe that because of the people's lack of faith, Jesus could not perform many miracles in Nazareth. Conclude by praying together that our families will continue to help us follow God in our lives. Pray together the Prayer for Vocations.



Whereas, an overwhelming majority of Americans, including low-income women and women of color who are most impacted by it, support the Hyde Amendment and laws that prevent government-funded abortion.

**Therefore,** I urge you, in the strongest possible terms, to ensure that the Hyde Amendment and all similar life-saving appropriations riders remain in place during the 117th Congress and beyond. Do not force Americans to subsidize the taking of innocent life. Oppose any bill, including any appropriations bill, that expands taxpayer funding of abortion.
